

Position Paper on the European refugee crisis

AEGEE-Aachen e.V.

The current refugee crisis is one of the biggest challenges in the modern Europe and is more and more driving Europe apart. Martin Schulz is warning the European Union, that "...the centrifugal forces of national egotism threaten to tear our union apart. Beggar thy neighbour policies will destroy our European project."^[1]. This needs, under all circumstances, to be avoided. AEGEE stands for an open minded, borderless and united Europe where everyone is treated equally and where laws and human rights are valid for everyone. The statutes of AEGEE-Europe^[2] state:

"Freedom and human rights are essential elements of a European society. Through our work and behavior, we aim to serve as an example and spread these values among the youth of our continent. [...] A strong Europe is built upon the foundations of respect, tolerance and solidarity. Following these values, we stand for an inclusive society where citizens enjoy equal opportunities and rights."

These rights should not only be valid for us but also for the hundred thousands of refugees coming to Europe. We can not longer accept the the apparent inability of governments, despite current efforts, to find a sustainable and humanitarian solution to this crisis. Therefore this challenge leads us to the following statements:

Regarding the refugee crisis, Europe has to create a better atmosphere of cooperation to work together on sustainable solutions instead of drifting apart from each other, because no one is willing to step away from its own national politics. Therefore, we are sure that the only solution to the refugee crisis is a strong and united Europe. Support from voluntary organisations and political institutions for integrative projects is also needed. To finance this, a general fund, paid by all member states of the European Union, is needed as well.

It is also clear that the member states where most refugees arrive cannot be left alone to cope with this challenge. Thus, AEGEE-Aachen recommends structured distribution of the refugees among the member states after taking into account, among other things, both population and economic strength of the countries.

We should not make it harder for the refugees to find their way to Europe, but rather help them to exercise the Asylum right they are entitled to. A holistic management of the inner- and outer-european borders needs to be developed. To do so, the European Union needs to adopt far-reaching reforms of the Dublin Convention towards a supranational solution. This is, in our opinion, the only acceptable and humanitarian way for Europe to solve the crisis and provide help to the refugees.

- Organization of intercultural workshops. We can learn a lot from each other!
 - o Organizing language tandems, e.g. nonverbal communication helps a lot.
- Organization of sports events.
 - o Sports in general have a very low language barrier.
 - "Changing Teams" tournament always mixes groups of locals and refugees.
- Organization of regular meetings for and with refugees, to facilitate contacts to the local population.

It is up to all of us now to take action and to help solve the crisis, to integrate the refugees and to make them feel safe!
